Salem Peace Lecture - Journalism vs. Fake News


Norman Solomon (pictured at right) will speak on "Independent Journalism and Fake News." He will discuss the role of news media in shaping political consciousness.

The annual Peace Lecture will be held on Wednesday, October 24, at 7:30 p.m. at Willamette University, Mary Stuart Rogers Music Center in Hudson Hall. Everyone is invited to this free event, which is cosponsored by AAUW.

About the speaker: Norman Solomon is an American journalist, media critic, antiwar activist, and former U.S. congressional candidate. Solomon is a longtime associate of the media watch group Fairness & Accuracy In Reporting (FAIR). In 1997 he founded the Institute for Public Accuracy

which works to provide alternative sources for journalists and serves as its executive director. Solomon's weekly column, "Media Beat", was in national syndication from 1992 to 2009. [photo]

Salem Branch Fall Membership Event at Gaiety Hollow

The first AAUW meeting of 2018-2019 was held on a sunny day in late September at the splendidly historic Gaiety Hollow Home and Garden on Mission St., across from Bush Gardens. More than thirty AAUW members and guests and were treated to docent-led tours of the stately home and garden, now owned by the Lord & Schryver Conservancy.

The property, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, was built in 1932 by renowned landscape architects Elizabeth Lord and Edith Schryver. Lord & Schryver, the first all-women landscape architecture company in the Northwest, also designed the glorious gardens that surround the home.

Bobbie Dolp, President of the Conservancy, told the story of how the home and garden came to be purchased by the group in 2005 in an effort to preserve the site, while providing an educational and cultural resource for the community. (Continued on Page 7)

Lord and Schryver, whose archives are housed at the University of Oregon, designed nearly 250 gardens in and around the Northwest area over their 40-year career. The women were instrumental in developing unique gardening styles such as using box hedges and brick walkways that make small areas look much larger and siting their buildings at the edge of the property, rather than the center, to allow more room for plantings.





Their influence can also be seen locally in the gardens surrounding the Bush Barn Art Center and Deepwood Estate. Ours was the last tour of the season of this wonderful home and garden, but tours will resume in the spring.

After the tour and refreshments, AAUW President Mary Ellen Dello Stritto presented two short films proudly illustrating AAUW's long and colorful history with the primary purpose of advocating for women and girls.

Mary Ellen discussed events for the coming year, the most important being that Salem is the site of the State Convention on April 12-14, 2019. The branch will also conduct oral histories with long-time members.

She also mentioned the Pink Walk Team, Eleanor Roosevelt's Birthday Party, and two electoral informational meetings, in conjunction with the League of Women Voters, at both Capital Manor and Loucks Auditorium at the Salem Library.

Mary Ellen reminded us that volunteer help will be needed, especially during the State Convention.


