AAUW Lobby Day Before Convention

AAUW of Oregon's Lobby Day will be Thursday, April 11, the day before the state convention in Salem. Lobby Day will be from 12:30 - 5:30 at the Department of Education Building (255 Capitol St.NE) across the street from the Capitol.

The theme of the 2019 Lobby Day will be *Student Success*. We are still finalizing our kick-off speaker and the participants in the Student Success panel, but we anticipate hearing from a senior official at the Oregon Department of Education, an advocate on behalf of the Oregon Education Association and a representative from the Confederation of Oregon School Administrators. You'll be able to ask them some great questions!

There will be a great "spread of appetizers" and beverages supplied at 12 noon before the program starts. The registration form for Lobby Day will be available on the state AAUW website soon and details of the convention will be in the next issue of *Oregon News*, which will be emailed soon.

Public Policy News

The 2019 Legislature is in full swing! The priority bills for AAUW of Oregon are:

- Funding (2 FTEs) for the Title IX Coordinators at the Oregon Dept. of Education
- Age discrimination bill unlawful if age is a factor in any way of a hiring decision
- High School Students must be able to demonstrate proficiency in civics
- Provides incarcerated women with feminine hygiene products free of charge
- Defines marriage as a civil contract entered into by persons at least 18 yo
- Ban non-disclosure and no rehire provisions in sexual harassment/assault
- Firearm safety (one ... (there are many) will be supported, based upon wording
- There are other education bills that are being evaluated as well.

Kappy Eaton, long-time member of AAUW and champion for women and girls will be remembered at the Capitol on Thursday, April 25th, by House Concurrent Resolution presented to the full House. This Resolution recognizes, at least in part, Kappy's significant contributions to our community. Stay tuned for details on the timing of this recognition.


